"Thus it was written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day."

Dear Parishioners of Spring Valley, Elmwood and Boyceville,

The major problem of the Jewish leaders who crucified Christ was ignorance. They thought they knew God and were advancing his course. On the contrary, they were actually working against it. Hence, they remained stubborn.

One important point which all the readings of today have in common is the relationship between ignorance and faith. Peter observed the Ignorance of the Jewish leaders. Hence, he addressed them: "It was you who accused the Holy One, the Just...Now brothers, I know that neither you nor your leaders had an idea of what you were doing."

They were waiting for the fulfillment of God's promises. However, when He came, they ignorantly rejected him. Hence, John writes: "Anyone who says I know him and does not keep his commandments is a lair refusing to admit the truth." Ignorance of God's command and will, leaves one with a false impression that he knows the truth. It makes one think that he is fighting for God, when actually the contrary is the case.

We should be different because, "the time of ignorance is over" (Acts 17, 30-31). It is over through the risen Christ, our advocate. Therefore, we must constantly seek divine counsel and illumination from Christ our advocate. Most importantly, we must constantly repent and receive forgiveness. John assures us today that: "We have an advocate before the Father who is Just, he is the sacrifice that takes our sins away..."

In the gospel, Christ continues to strengthen the faith of his disciples by illuminating their minds with the scriptures. Even though they heard him preach, and saw his miracles, they were ignorant of what the scriptures said about Him. St Jerome reminds us that: "Ignorance of the scriptures is ignorance of Christ." Ignorance of God's word and commandments is a major stumbling block to faith.

Today's gospel also reveals something very important. Often, we think that only Thomas doubted the resurrection of Christ. However, without contradicting John, Luke simply takes us further, by revealing that Thomas was not alone in this boat. Jesus asked his disciples: "Why are you agitated, and why are these doubts rising in your hearts? Of course, Jesus knew that most of his disciples doubted, even though they did not manifest it out publicly. So, he did everything humanly possible to convince them.

How many of us attend Sunday Masses and yet, do not believe in the Eucharist? How many are Christians, and yet do not believe in the resurrection of the dead. How many receive the sacrament of confession, and yet do not believe in the forgiveness of sin? How many are Christians, and yet do not believe that Jesus is true God and true man. How many of us are Christians, and yet do not believe that Christ was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit. These are different shades of doubt. We manifest them differently. May the risen Christ illuminate our minds that we may believe in him.


